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Note From Executive Director, Doug Hague


I hope each of you has gotten a vacation or break this summer. It has been a long pandemic and while not over, at least we are seeing some return to the new normal. A few reminders for you:

Access to the Twitter Decahose Feed



In addition to the 1B+ Tweets on COVID-19, the School of Data Science has an agreement in place with Twitter which will enable UNC-Charlotte researchers to access the Twitter Decahose feed. The Decahose is a statistically relevant, real-time feed of 10% of Twitter content. Throughput volume is approximately 0.3TB/day.

Presidential Management Fellows (PMF) Class of 2022 Application Cycle - Please share with students

The Presidential Management Fellows (PMF) Program is administered by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM). The PMF Program is a leadership development program at the entry-level for advanced degree candidates in STEM fields. As such, students in the DSBA and HIA PSM programs are well-positioned to apply for this program. The Program attracts and selects the best candidates possible, but is really designed with a more narrow focus - developing a cadre of potential government leaders. It provides some sustenance during the first years of employment and encourages the development of leadership capabilities. The PMF Program inculcates a lasting bond as well as a spirit of public service, ultimately encouraging and leading to a career in the government.

TA Allocation for 2021-2022

The SDS will start the process of allocating TA support for Spring 2022 SDS

classes. If you are teaching a **DTSC**, **HCIP**, **or DSBA course** this spring you should be on the lookout for an email in late September with information regarding the specific class allocation and a link to a Google Forms folder with eligible candidates. In anticipation, we wanted to review the policy on how SDS-funded Teaching Assistantships are assigned.

The SDS pays master's candidates \$5,100 for a full-time (15 weeks/20 hours a week) and \$2,550 for a half-time(15 weeks/10 hours a week) assignment, roughly \$17.00 an hour. These positions are funded through the HIA and DSBA Tuition Increments. As a result, with few exceptions, we require the students selected to be a TA for an SDS course, to be enrolled in an SDS program.

SDS Enrollment/TA Allocation

- 25 or more students = 20 hours a week
- 15-24 students = 10 hours a week
- Less than 15 students = 0 hours

General requirements for SDS-funded assistantships can be found here. Some important high points:

- Students holding an SDS-funded assistantship must be registered for a minimum of 6 credit hours and a maximum of 9 credit hours.
- Students must have a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- Assistantships do not come with tuition remission.
- International students are eligible to hold an assistantship, but they need to sign up for the ISSO workshop if they have not already done so.
