

Submissions due December 31st

To support the safety of highly capable AI systems, OpenAI is developing its approach to catastrophic risk preparedness, including building a Preparedness team and launching a challenge. Their team will offer \$25,000 each in API credits to up to 10 top submissions, publish novel ideas and entries, and look for candidates for Preparedness from among the top contenders in this challenge.
