## A Utility Aware Framework for Privately Sharing Individual Level Data

October 1, 2022 - September 30, 2027

Total Intended Award Amount: \$574,877.00

Abstract: Individual level data can be collected and shared to benefit a wide range of research studies and exploratory applications. However, most privacy protecting data sharing solutions focus on well-defined aggregate analysis and do not take into account the application's utility goals. Furthermore, current solutions may be limited in addressing the application-specific privacy needs, resulting in overly strong or inadequate privacy protection.

This project develops novel privacy protecting data sharing solutions by incorporating an application's privacy needs and utility goals in one optimization framework. [More info](#)

### **FDA releases IT strategy for 2024-2027**

The FDA's Information Technology Strategy for fiscal 2024 to 2027 focuses on modernization, intra-agency integration, data sharing, new technologies and investment in employees. Six goals include creating the shared OneFDA IT ecosystem, modernizing IT infrastructure, improving enterprise services, enabling the broad sharing of data, analyzing benefits and risks associated with AI and other emerging technologies, and building a team of experts, leaders and employees. ### **Minn. developing disease outbreak prediction tools**

Health informatics professor R. Adams Dudley is co-leading a \$17 million project in Minnesota to develop metrics that can be used to predict disease outbreak severity based on human behavior. Researchers will survey state residents to understand their daily activities and interactions, tap the new Minnesota EHR Consortium, which links clinic and hospital medical records to identify trends, and test new predictive tools by running simulations on COVID-19 pandemic patterns. ### **Genomics alliance adds 10 Driver Projects**

Ten international genomic data initiatives have been named the Global Alliance for Genomics and Health's "Driver Projects" to enable greater use of genomic data standards in clinical care and biomedical research. "The 10 new GA4GH Driver Projects will foster ... engagement between research, medicine and standards development," said Heidi Rehm, a GA4GH vice chair and chief genomics officer at Massachusetts General Hospital. ### **NLM digitizes historically significant biomedical journals**

From 2014 to 2019, the National Library of Medicine digitized back issues of hundreds of significant biomedical journals and their citations. Since completing that project, the NLM has digitized back issues under the Creative Commons Public Domain Mark, including The Homoeopathic Physician, The Dental Register, The Dental Reporter, the Buffalo Medical Journal and the Atlanta Journal-Record of Medicine.
