SDS Assistantship Spring 2025 Applications Open- Undergrads and Grads

Interested in serving as a Teaching, Research, or Instructional Assistant? The applications for spring 2025 are now available on your program websites! The School of Data Science is offering assistantships for graduate and undergraduate students enrolled in SDS programs. Only SDS students are eligible to apply. Appointments can be full-time (20 hours per week) or part-time (10 hours per week), with awards granted for one semester and potential extensions available. SDS appointments do not include tuition remission. To be eligible, students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and be enrolled in an SDS program. Full-time TAs can enroll in a maximum of 9 credit hours. The assistantships are open to in-state, out-of-state, and international students, including both current and newly admitted students in the DSBA, Health Informatics, or Data Science undergraduate programs.
