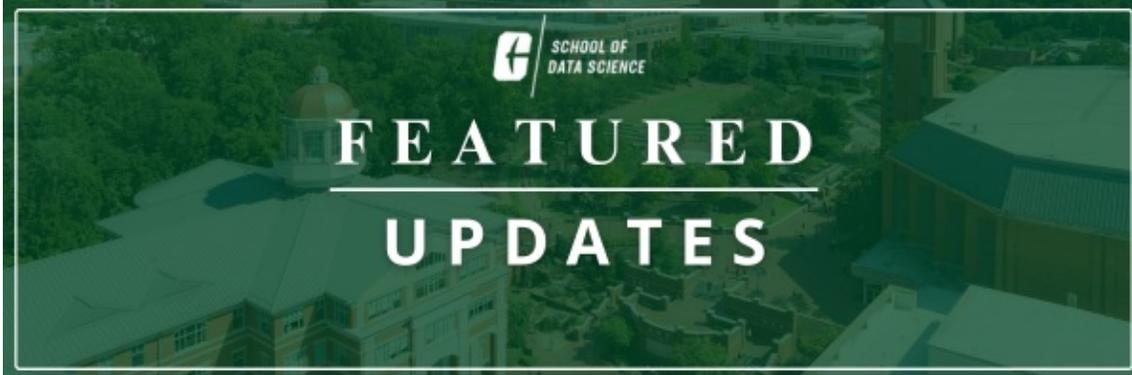
Happy New Year!

A few major updates:

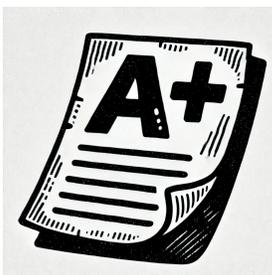
- The faculty search committee reviewed 167 applications for the two tenure-track assistant professor positions and Zoom interviewed 20+ of them before selecting 7 for campus interviews in December. Those faculty candidates will visit the school, give their job talks, and meet with faculty and students from Jan. 27 to Feb. 10. These are the first two tenure-track faculty we will hire for the school. Your active participation in their campus interviews and feedback will be much appreciated.
- The Ph.D. application deadline is Feb. 1, 2025. The Ph.D. admission committee will start reviewing the applications soon.
- The first faculty meeting of SDS in Spring 2025 will be held virtually on Zoom at 2:30pm on Jan. 15. One of the major meeting agenda items will be for me to answer any questions from the faculty regarding SDS MOUs, in which all faculty members need to sign before Feb. 10.
- SDS will have multiple offices in the Colvard building (1048A~G) renovated for our faculty use this Spring. They should be available before July.
- SDS also plans to launch the new Undergraduate Sports Analytics Program in Fall 2025.

SDS will host the annual Charlotte Women in Data Science (WiDS) Conference on March 13th and the Analytics Frontiers Conference (AFC) on April 3rd. WiDS is a free event, and AFC offers a reduced price (\$49) for SDS faculty. From Academic Affairs: Early Feedback for Students



As you prepare for Spring 2025, please ensure your syllabus allows for early feedback, as it helps students improve by raising awareness of academic concerns. Reporting all low grades is encouraged and can be done via Canvas. If teaching a multi-section course, collaborate with colleagues to establish criteria for early alerts and midterm performance. Reminder: Required Training for new Teaching Assistants



As we approach the start of the Spring 2025 semester, a quick reminder that **all new Teaching Assistants must complete the mandatory TA Training** to comply with UNC-Charlotte's SACS accreditation requirements. This online training is in addition to any program-specific training.

Key Details:

- **Training Platform:** All modules and quizzes are available on Canvas (TA Training Spring 2025).
- **Completion Requirement:** TAs must achieve at least 80% overall to complete the training. Quizzes are due by January 19, 2025.
- **Responsibility:** It is the responsibility of the TA to complete the training by the deadline. Failure to do so may affect future TA contracts.
- **Open for Review:** The training site remains open for the entire academic year, allowing TAs to revisit material as needed.

The new Google Research Scholar program is now accepting applications! In each funding cycle, the RS program aims to support early-career professors (received Ph.D. within 7 years) who are pursuing research in fields relevant to Google. The program provides unrestricted gifts to help support world-class research at institutions around the world conducted by early-career professors. Faculty whose PhDs were awarded in 2017 or later are eligible. Funding is only about \$60k, but it comes as an unrestricted gift with bragging rights. Applications are due by January 27. This initiative seeks to create, develop, and validate a quantitative metric to assess and reward effective data-sharing practices. The S-index will evaluate how well researchers share data for future use, considering factors such as adherence to FAIR (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, and Reusable) standards, data timeliness, annotation completeness, reuse in other studies, and associated publications or patents. 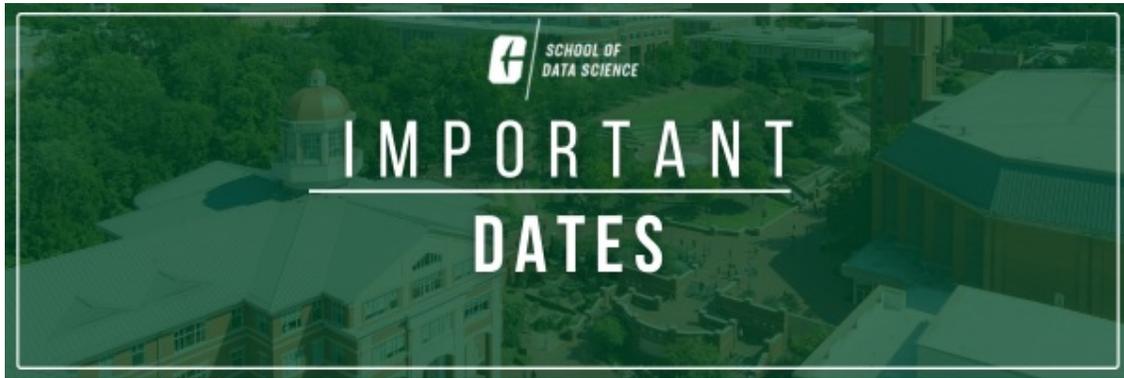

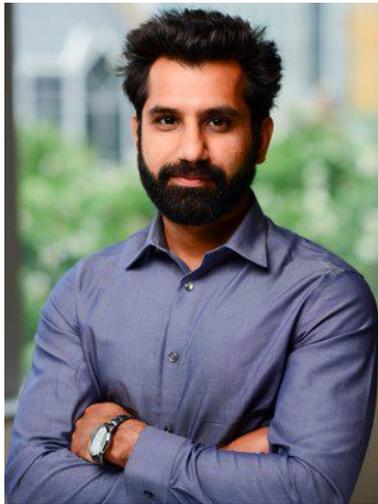
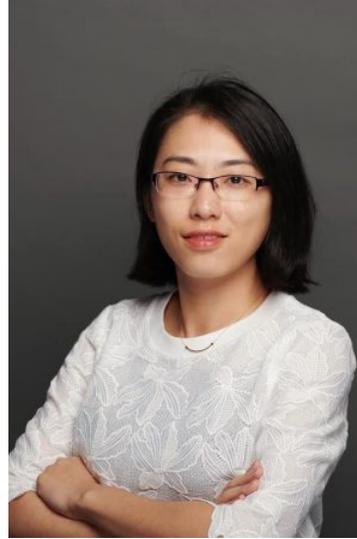
New Faces with the SDS: Welcoming New Adjunct Faculty

Imaging startup CEO sees potential in AI czar appointment

President-elect Donald Trump has appointed David Sacks as the first White House czar for AI and cryptocurrency, a move expected to lead to looser regulations. Ryan Tarzy, CEO of Avandra Imaging, supports the appointment, believing it will accelerate healthcare innovation and improve patient outcomes.
