Group Advising for DSBA & HIA Students Spring 2026 Registration

It's time to prepare for **Spring 2026 registration!** The DSBA Group Advising Session was held on Wednesday, October 8. If you were unable to attend, a recording is available—please reach out to **Carly Mahedy** to access it.

The **HIA Group Advising Session** will be held on **Monday, October 13, from 4:00 to 5:00 PM via Zoom**, and all students are encouraged to attend. These sessions provide an opportunity to review your course plan, learn about new course offerings and events, and get answers to any questions about the registration process. Most DSBA and HIA courses no longer require prior authorization. As long as you meet the prerequisites, you can register directly for courses within your program. Special approval is still required for repeating **DSBA 6010 – Special Topics**, taking multiple sections at once, or enrolling in **Capstone courses** (DSBA 6400 – Internship, 6390 – Capstone, and 6991 – Thesis). Details will be reviewed during the advising sessions.

Be sure to check your **DegreeWorks audit** to confirm remaining program requirements, and certificate students should remember they cannot take courses outside of the five required for the certificate. Additionally, check your student account for any **holds** prior to registration, which opens on **October 27**.

Toward a Deeper Understanding of PREVENT for Cardiovascular Risk

Presenter: Chuan Hong, PhD, Assistant Professor of Biostatistics, Duke University

Dr. Hong will discuss findings from a large-scale evaluation of the American Heart Association’s PREVENT model for predicting cardiovascular disease (CVD) risk. Using data from more than 550,000 adults in the Truveta platform, the study examined fairness across demographic and social determinants of health (SDOH) subgroups and tested whether adding SDOH predictors improves model performance. Results showed the PREVENT model maintains strong calibration and fairness across most groups, with some disparities by race, education, and insurance. Adding SDOH variables or recalibrating the model offered minimal additional benefit—supporting the robustness and practical utility of the original PREVENT equations in real-world populations. 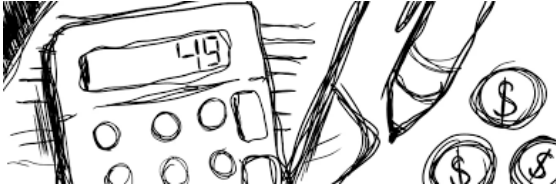

NIH Launches \$50M Autism Data Science Initiative to Advance Understanding

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) has announced the Autism Data Science Initiative (ADSI) - a landmark \$50 million effort to uncover the biological, environmental, and social factors behind autism spectrum disorder.



The initiative will fund 13 pioneering projects that integrate genomic, clinical, behavioral, and environmental data using advanced analytics and machine learning. By combining large-scale datasets with the study of environmental influences on health, ADSI aims to clarify the complex interactions driving autism prevalence and improve outcomes across the lifespan.
