# AI for Data Science Practitioners: Now Accepting Applications for Fall 2026

The School of Data Science is now accepting applications for the new **Graduate Certificate in AI for Data Science Practitioners**. It is a 15-credit-hour, in-person program designed to equip students and working professionals with practical, in-demand skills in artificial intelligence and data science. The curriculum emphasizes hands-on experience across the full AI lifecycle, including data engineering, machine learning, deep learning, large language models, agentic AI, and responsible AI practices. This program is ideal for individuals with backgrounds in data science, computer science, mathematics, engineering, health informatics, and related quantitative fields who are looking to deepen their AI expertise or upskill for rapidly evolving industry roles. The program is open to full and part-time students with classes held at the Dubois Center in uptown Charlotte. [Applications are now open for Fall 2026 entry.](#)

Significant updates are coming to the Health Informatics and Analytics (HIAN) curriculum for **Fall 2026**. These changes are designed to streamline the program and better align it with the evolving fields of data science and health analytics. Current students will have a choice: remain in the existing curriculum or opt into the new academic plan.

### HIAN Curriculum Changes Coming for Fall 2026

Effective Fall 2026 (pending approval)

- Program name change: Health Informatics and Analytics, M.S. → Data Science and Health Analytics (DSHC)
- Who is affected: Students enrolled prior to Fall 2026 will remain under the original program name and curriculum ***unless they choose to update their curriculum year.***
- Key proposed updates:
  - Elimination of Restricted Electives (6 credits)
  - Reduction in total program credits from 36 to 30
- Updated concentrations:
  - Population Health Analytics (PHA)
  - AI and Data Science for Health (ADH)

Effective **July 1**, the School of Data Science will see several leadership transitions across its graduate programs, strengthening continued growth and innovation in both **Data Science and Business Analytics (DSBA)** and **Data Science and Health Analytics (DSHA)** (formerly Health Informatics and Analytics).

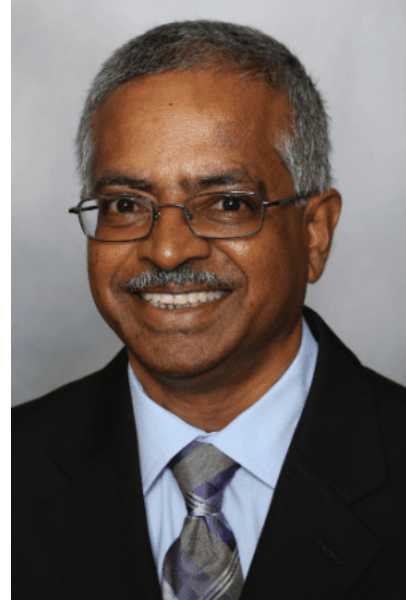
## DSBA Program Leadership Transitions

**Dr. Mirsad Hadzikadic** will be stepping back from teaching and from his role as Graduate Program Director of the DSBA program. This is not a farewell or retirement; Dr. Hadzikadic will remain affiliated with the School of Data Science and the University in an emeritus capacity. As the inaugural Executive Director of the Data Science Initiative, which evolved into the School of Data Science, Dr. Hadzikadic played a foundational role in shaping the School's vision, growth, and identity. He has been a steadfast advocate for students and faculty throughout his tenure. Most recently, he led a comprehensive curriculum review and the launch of the **AI for Data Science Graduate Certificate**, helping position the School at the forefront of emerging AI education. In the year ahead, new courses in areas such as agentic AI, data engineering, and large language model applications reflect the continued impact of his leadership. We thank Dr. Hadzikadic for his lasting contributions and continued engagement with the School.



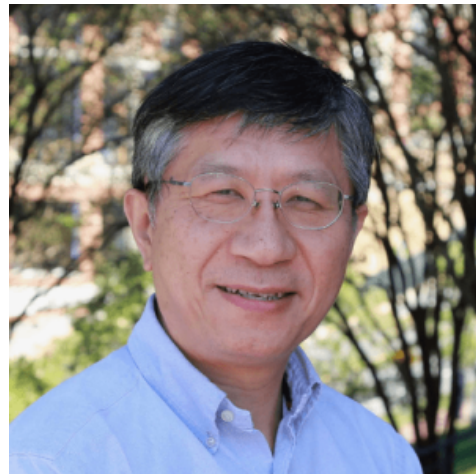
Effective July 1, **Dr. Chandrasekar Subramaniam** will step back into the role of Graduate Program Director for DSBA. He is an Associate Professor of Management Information Systems, who recently completed his service as Department Chair of Business Information Systems and Operations. Dr. Subramaniam earned his Ph.D. in Business Information Systems from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign.

He teaches courses including Business Intelligence and Analytics (DSBA 6201), Advanced Analytics (DSBA 6211), and Big Data Analytics for Competitive Advantage (DSBA 6100). His research focuses on electronic commerce, enterprise information systems, and inter-organizational systems. He has published widely in leading information systems journals and brings extensive international academic experience, including prior faculty service at Bharathidasan Institute of Management in India. We are pleased to welcome him back to the role of Graduate Program Director and to lead the ongoing innovation within the DSBA.



### **DSHA (formerly HIA) Graduate Program Leadership**

Also, as announced earlier, **Dr. Yaorong Ge** will step back from his role as Graduate Program Director of the Health Informatics and Analytics program. During his tenure, Dr. Ge led key curriculum revisions that strengthened the program's academic foundation and enhanced its alignment with industry and research priorities. We are grateful for his leadership and lasting impact on the program's development.



Effective July 1, **Dr. Rajib Paul**, Professor in the School of Data Science, will assume the role of Graduate Program Director for DSHA. Dr. Paul brings deep expertise in health analytics, epidemiology, and advanced statistical methods, along with a strong record of externally funded research and graduate student mentorship. We look forward to his leadership as the program continues to evolve under its updated identity and curriculum direction.

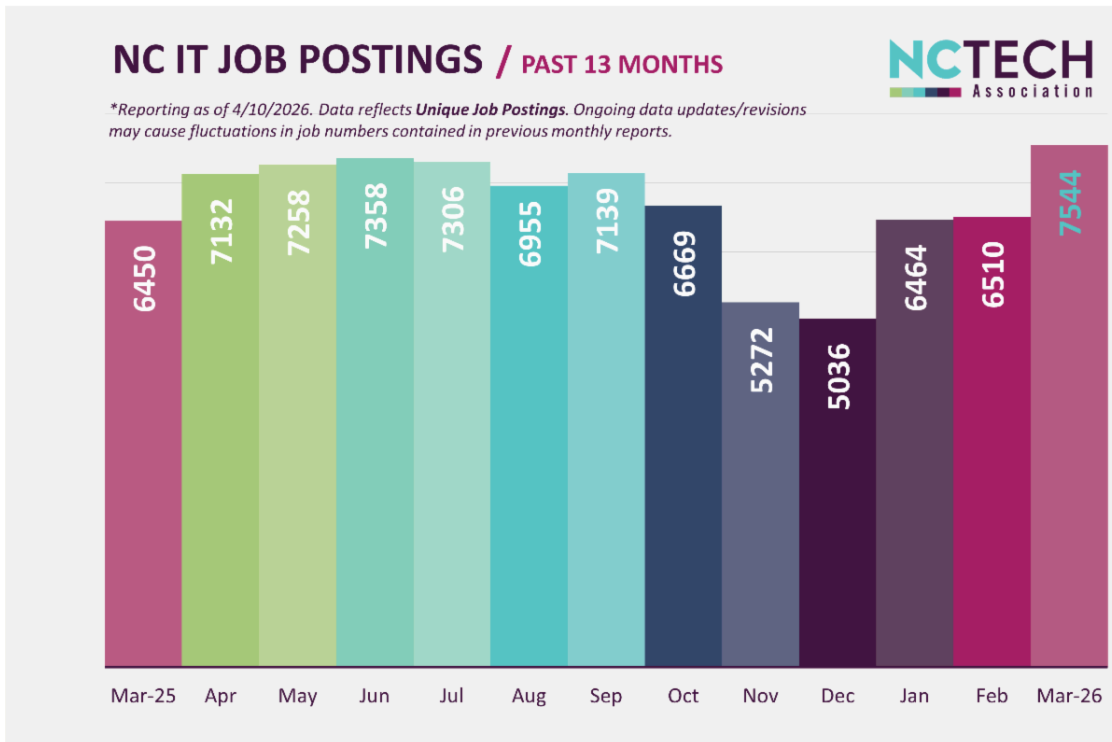

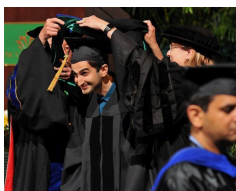
